Washington D.C. Conference

Three hundred delegates and distinguished guests from across the country attended the American Legion Auxiliary's annual Washington DC Conference February 22-25, at the Washington Hilton Hotel in Washington, D.C. The mid-year event provides an opportunity for Auxiliary leadership to hear from Washington experts on issues relevant to the Auxiliary's mission and to meet with Congressional representatives on key legislative priorities.

NEC Marlys Aubol participated in the Parade of Checks and presented National President Janet Jefford with \$1000 for her project, ALA Foundation- Veterans Projects Fund.

Auxiliary members attended a joint session with The American Legion and met with senators and representatives on Capitol Hill to discuss The American Legion Family's legislative priorities. Hot-button legislative issues H.R.203-Clay Hunt SAV Act (suicide prevention); H.R.22-Hire More Heroes Act of 2015; H.R.456: Reducing Barriers for Veterans Education Act of 2015; and Veterans' Access to Hearing Health Act of 2015 were discussed with Senator John Hoeven and Senator Heidi Heitkamp. Representative Kevin Cramer was unable to meet the group, but his Executive Assistant, Tyler Flom visited with the delegation.

Marlys Aubol shared, "One concern is suicide prevention- finding out why the suicide rate is high and what we can do to prevent it without high doses of medication. The VA Medical Centers are doing a great job on the service level, but the Administration level seems to be struggling. Veteran education and employment is also a concern. Another, is when a military family moves to a different location, that it would be easy for the spouse to find a job. If the spouse is a teacher, some states do not require that a teacher be certified in the state to which she has recently moved. The goal is to have all 50 states waive that requirement."

Hello Ladies of the ALA:

I hope all of you are healthy and enjoying our mostly mild winter.

At the mid-winter conference, I was able to see some of you and you heard my talk about NVDA (No Veteran Dies Alone), but I want everyone to know what a great program the VA Hospital here in Fargo has.

I am a volunteer of this program and I have seen first-hand what a great staff the VA Hospital has and how they take such good care of Veterans who are terminal. But they cannot do it all because those Veterans who do not have family or the family needs a break- that is where the volunteer comes in.

I have been with five Veterans and four of those have not had family and I have stayed overnight and been there for them. We do not want the Veteran to die alone.

So if you should have a loved one who is at the VA Hospital some day and need the service (a family member or friend) and the family has to travel a long distance and cannot be there every day, know that you can have a volunteer to help. This is a great hospice program the VA Hospital has.

If any of you or your family need the service, or if you know of a homeless Veteran and they need to be at the hospital, please inform them that they will not be alone.

I am so happy to be in this program and that I can be with a Veteran when needed.

National Security

Your Units do lots and lots of things that fall under National Security. At our Round Table Discussions at Winter Conference in Bismarck, I was the one asking the question "What do you do?" Then I told them that could be reported under National Security. I did not receive one report that I could forward to Shirley Frederick, National Security Chairman for the Northwestern Division.



There is much information on the National web site under National Security. I had Cat print lots of the information for me to pass out the Winter Conference. Please go to the NDALA website for the handouts, ideas and to see if what you do can be reported under National Security. You may also ask one of your members who attended the Conference to share the information I gave them.

Some of the members told me that they cut out coupons that can be sent to our deployed troops. They can have an expired date of six months. It is a great way to save money when buying groceries, personal items or paper products. There wasn't a special address- they sent the coupons to family members or someone from the community who is deployed. Get out those scissors while watching TV and cut out those coupons! NATIONAL SECURITY!

Host a POW/MIA ceremony on National POW/MIA Recognition Day, commemorated annually on the third Friday of September. Follow the Legion's POW/MIA Empty Chair Resolution 288 for designating a POW/MIA Empty Chair at all official meetings. NATIONAL SECURITY!

Reports are due to me by April 15. As part of your narrative report please include answers to the following questions:

- How many Blue Star and Gold Star Banners were presented?
- How many MIA families were recognized following notification of remains?
- How many service members were honored during welcome-home events?

Support the emotional and social needs of active, reserve and transitioning military service members and their families.

If needed, see, "How to Collaborate with the American Red Cross Service to the Armed Forces."

"How to Collaborate with the Hiring our Heroes Military Spouse eMentor Program." The American Legion Auxiliary supports the Military Spouse Employment Program of the U. S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation's Hiring Our Heroes Initiative. There are two ways a unit or member can get involved with this program: 1) by organizing or participating in hiring and networking events or 2) by serving as a mentor. National President Janet Jefford spoke with two of our legislators about supporting military families if a spouse is a teacher—that spouse can move to any state and get a teaching position without being certified in that state. I will get a report from our legislators on that issue and report to you.

"How to Identify Veteran and Service member Families who are in Need of Assistance." Here are a few ideas:

- Send care packages to deployed service members.
- Assist with transportation
- Childcare
- Temporary financial assistance
- Lawn maintenance and minor/major house repairs
- Emotional support
- Possibilities are endless—just be there for them.

NATIONAL SECURITY
"How to Train for a Federal Emergency Management Agency Community Emergency Response Team." The American Legion Auxiliary, through the National Security Program, calls upon ALA members to maintain strong communities at home. Part of that includes being prepared for natural and man-made emergencies that occur. NATIONAL SECURITY!

"How to Welcome Home Separating Service Members." Support the individual service member by welcoming him/her home, and celebrating with them. Spread the word that this event is happening. Involve the media. NATIONAL SECURITY!

This is just a tip of the iceberg—what a program! We are the support and the backbone for getting the support that the military and their families need.
