The Department Chairmen shared some fun and novel ideas about how to work the programs of the ALA. For myself, I was proud of the members of this organization in their contributions to the President's project, Pennies for Projects for Vets. It was an honor to be able to tell all in attendance that we have already exceeded the one million penny goal. I can only imagine where the contributions will be by the end of this year. The Finance Board and Department Executive Committee met on Friday and addressed several issues of the American Legion Auxiliary, including budget and expenditure issues and also the need for candidates to run for upcoming openings within our slate of officers. On Saturday the Department Chairmen in attendance had their displays up for viewing and presentations began. We concluded our conference on Sunday with a breakfast meeting and an emotional memorial service during which the Four Chaplains and Past District President Martha Johnson were honored. Session closed, as it opened, with a joint session with The American Legion, the ALA and the Sons of the Legion. All days were quite busy and filled with information. We thank Minot for hosting this event and look forward to the next gathering of our organization at the Convention in Williston.

Even though we look forward to that Convention we cannot let ourselves relax and sit back. There is much work to do between now and then. One of the major topics brought forward at Conference was the drastic drop in membership this year. As an organization we know that we lose some of our members each year for various reasons. However the drop this year is so drastic that we need to truly look at the budget for the year. We all know that our operations are funded by membership. When our membership decreases, our ability to operate our programs is at risk. The most recent membership numbers, received from our National Membership team, report that North Dakota is in 25th place in the nation, with an 80.51% membership submitted. Our numeric objective is 13,430. North Dakota has submitted, to this report date of February 15, 2013, a total number of memberships of 10,813. Yes 80% is a great level to be at, however, the alarming thing about this is that it converts to dollars missing from the ALA funds to operate and run programs. This shortfall is equivalent to over \$25,000. This amount will have a significant impact on how this Department can perform the Mission of the ALA. I cannot stress to the members how important it is to go out and get those renewals! It is not just the membership chairman that is responsible for getting the renewals and the new members. We need to each take a personal approach to increasing our membership numbers. Take time to talk to members, one on one, remind our Auxiliary ladies WHY THEY JOINED! We serve those who serve, this is our mission, this why we joined!

Soon we will be having Spring District meetings, I encourage all members to attend your district meetings, and bring another member with you. Meeting dates are posted elsewhere in this paper. Many Districts will be having elections. Have you thought about who will fill the shoes of District officers? We have leaders in our midst, they just have not been asked to step forward yet. If you know someone who would make a good leader, now is the time to begin discussion with them. Encourage them, and offer your support as they take that step forward to leadership within our organization. We recently have received a mandate from National that, just like our Units, Districts will have to hold a Charter. Secretary Ronholm and I will be working with District Presidents to get this task accomplished. Remember that we are Angels in service, and are commanded this year to Soar to New Heights in our Service to veterans, our military and their families. Linda Juntunen, Department President

Unit Historians, I encourage each of you to prepare and submit your history for judging at convention.




