## Legion Post 124 Celebrates Centennial

The American Legion and Auxiliary #124 of McClusky celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of the American Legion on Sunday, April 7, 2019, at the McClusky Elementary School.

Sixty veterans, ALA members, and their guests attended the Centennial Celebration. A slide show, put together by Legion Commander Shawn Koltes, featuring pictures of veterans, their branch of service, and where they were stationed was shown. An impressively narrated video of the British attack on Fort Henry in the Baltimore Harbor which resulted in the writing of The Star Spangled Banner in the midst of the battle was also shown.

James Paulus, Sheridan County Veterans Service Officer, gave information on the vans and drivers available to veterans for any medical appointment, the "Helmets for Heroes" project, and the option/advantages of having a "V" (Veteran) placed on a veteran's drivers license.

Guests enjoyed a delicious meal of chicken and strudel prepared by Sherri Roth. Auxiliary senior and junior members served the guests. A cake, decorated with the Legion Emblem by Marjory Rau, was served for dessert.

The McClusky American Legion post is named in memory of James Roberts who homesteaded near McClusky in 1916. When he entered the service in 1917, he was classified as a gunner in the infantry. Mr. Roberts contracted the flu and died at a base hospital in France in 1918. In 1919, an organizational meeting was held at the Sheridan County Courthouse for the purpose of organizing an American Legion Post. Members voted to name the Post after their fallen comrade, James Roberts. O.M. Pickard was elected their first president.

The local Auxiliary was organized in 1923. Thirteen women became charter members. They elected Mrs. E.R. Hagg as their president. A temporary charter was granted in March of 1923. The permanent charter was granted in March of 1925.

The national American Legion was chartered in 1919, evolving from a group of war-weary veterans of World War I into one of the most influential nonprofit groups in the US. They organized under the official name of The American

Legion. Later that year, their emblem was adopted. The first Legion convention convened in Minneapolis where their official preamble and constitution were adopted. Today, the Legion continues to lobby for adequate funding to cover medical, disability, education, and other benefits for veterans.
