## Donnybrook Celebrates American Legion 100th Anniversary

Excitement was in the air on Saturday, June 22, 2019. Friends, family, neighbors, Legion and Auxiliary members from across the state of North Dakota gathered in Donnybrook to celebrate the American Legion's 100th anniversary.

Donnybrook, a community of 60 inhabitants located 35 miles northwest of Minot, ND, hosted nearly 600 hundred visitors for this one-day celebration. There was something for everyone, including a parade, games, a water balloon throwing contest, bouncy houses for the little ones, a USO show, military memorabilia display at the Post and two community picnics. There was lots of food, visiting and laughter, and a street dance to wrap up the festivities.

The parade featured American Legion Department Commander Glenn Wahus, First Lady Tina Wahus and Auxiliary Department President Jeannie Román serving as Grand Marshals. Honorary Grand Marshals included: Jerry Munch, a 52-year member of Post 195; Wally Birkeland, a 51-year member of Post 195; and Betty Steinberger, a 71-year member of Unit 195.

Members of the Clarence McCormick Post and Unit 195 worked countless hours planning and preparing for the 'big day'. The entire community was involved in some way with the local 4-H organization and volunteers from the Minot Air Force Base 91st Missile Wing serving lunch throughout the day and Donnybrook's Volunteer Fire Department serving supper in Donnybrook Community Park. Nearly 500 were in the audience for the USO show and to top off the day, the band, "Too Old to Stand" based in Bottineau, ND, performed at the street dance.

Marilyn Bott, Unit 195 President and event co-chairman was quoted as saying, "The Donnybrook event was a huge success. We couldn't have asked for a more beautiful day and the crowd was awesome! I think I'll put my feet up now and relax for awhile!"

## World War II Veteran Anselma Clemetson Receives 65-Year Membership Honor

Anselma (Selma) Clemetson, a 65-year member of Paul Farup Unit 147 Park River, ND, received a membership certificate from Dianne Greicar in July. Selma joined the unit in 1954 and is also a member of the Legion Post.

At 97, Selma is one of the oldest living veterans in North Dakota. She served in the US Navy (WAVES) from 1943-1945, as a code girl, typing and sending out orders. Code girls took an oath to not reveal any of the orders crossing their desks for 50 years after leaving the service.

President Franklin Roosevelt signed the Navy Women's Reserve Act into law on July 30, 1942, creating what was commonly known as the WAVES (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service), a division of the U.S. Navy created during World War II to "free up male personnel for sea duty".

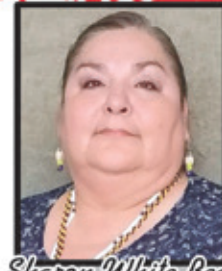

Most American Legion Auxiliary members participate in community service projects throughout the year. What is 'community service' you ask?

Community Service is a non-paying job performed by one person or a group of people for the benefit of their community.

Some of our small communities rely on community service to survive. Community service can be performed by volunteering hours, monetary donations or miles driven. A few examples of community service are helping a disabled veteran drive to an appointment, helping serve a funeral luncheon, cleaning up or planting flowers in a local park, helping walk pets for the disabled, putting up and taking down decorations for the elderly, helping put down sandbags for flood victims, donating funds to spay and neuter animals and donating funds or food to your local food bank. The list goes on and on of things that are considered Community Service.

Remember to keep track of your Community Service hours, miles driven, and funds donated each month. If you belong to other organizations, you may count those volunteer hours too! Unit members Community Service hours should be reported to your Unit's Community Service Chairman. They are then reported to your Unit President who in turn reports to your District President.

When performing Community Service, remember to proudly wear your American Legion Auxiliary pins, earrings, hats and t-shirts.

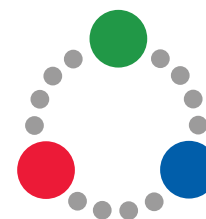
