





ALA National Headquarters gave each Department and Girls State program guidance suggesting that they consult their respective program Constitution and Bylaws regarding accepting seniors in the program next year. At this time, there is no statement in our ND Girls State Constitution and Bylaws that would prohibit having senior girls attend.

What we want to do for the summer and fall of 2020 is take the names of girls that are interested and continue to reach out to them. We are looking at sending monthly emails, possibly including a short video clip from ND ALA Girls State counselors, to keep them excited about the program as well as giving them more information on what to expect. What we need from units is to keep sending in names of girls that would be interested in ND ALA Girls State, including the upcoming juniors. It's never too early to promote the program. This is an extension of recruitment efforts and by no means a replacement for the 2020 session. The ND ALA Girls State board believes that by using this platform we can get girls excited about 2021, and in turn, they can help us find more young women that would like to be involved. The ND ALA Girls State board has requested approval for 2021 session dates of June 13th-18th from the ND ALA Department Executive Committee.



As we are not certain when the next DEC meeting will be held, we appreciate your understanding that we are unable to confirm dates at this time and consider them pending approval and not set in stone.
