We just returned from the American Legion Family 2023 Winter Conference in Minot held January 27-29. I hope you have time to read what my thoughts were from the weekend.

His words really sparked my interest when he spoke about the importance of your 'membership' in our organization. Original Dickinson Charter Dedicated

On November 14, 2022, Matthew Brew Unit 3 Auxiliary members gathered for a grateful and patriotic duty to dedicate the original charter as a perpetual memorial to the Auxiliary's efforts and commitment to our veterans. The unit has had a copy of the original charter but recently discovered the original among vintage records in storage. The original charter proved that the unit initially organized in May 1920, received formal permission to organize in 1925, and on May 20, 1926, became the official American Legion Auxiliary to Matthew Brew Post 3.

Endorsements by the Department and National offices occurred May 19, May 26, June 11, and May 20 of the year 1926. There were 12 original members. A current Unit 3 member generously and anonymously donated the matting and framing of the document by JP Frameshop Western Edge Gallery of Dickinson.


Greetings North Dakota Auxiliary Members

the Creative Arts Festival and POW/MIA awareness. Other Department leaders gave updates on programs as well. With all the current natural disasters, the Auxiliary Emergency Fund has provided more help for members in the first quarter of 2023 than all of last year. It was stressed that dues be sent in as soon as possible and not to hold them. There are 13 units in the Department that have reached 100% or more already.

We learned 155 members have passed in the last year. Department President Sandra Petermann displayed information regarding the Four Chaplains and reminded us of its history. There are multiple scholarships available from both the American Legion and Auxiliary. 
