Children and Youth 2023-2024 Report

The Legion Auxiliary of North Dakota works hard year-round in every District and Unit. Here are some examples:

UNIT 166 WALCOTT -Donated money to charities such as St. Jude's, Shriners, and Toys for Tots. Supplies were also donated to the elementary school in Kindred.

UNIT 29 WATFORD CITY-Delivered poppies and coloring books to all 1st graders in town. Legion/Auxiliary members sponsor a field trip for 2nd graders teaching the importance of Veterans, and their service to our country and community. The students are involved in flag folding and the meaning behind each fold. Several area youths were awarded the opportunity to attend International Music Camp.

UNIT 6 GRAND FORKS-Donated money to the Northland Rescue Mission Backpack program to insure that children won't go hungry over the weekend. They also donated to the Safe Kids Program. Members have also worked at Legion baseball tournaments where an auxiliary member awarded a senior player the Rudy Kraemer award and \$100.00 in honor of her late husband.

UNIT 135 MCVILLE-Leading up to Memorial Day, poppies were distributed door to door by a young junior member and her brother. A poppy poster contest was held. The unit fulfilled requests for items for their school through the 10 for Education Program. For Veterans Day, area children made cards to be given to the local care and assisted living homes as well as sending some to the Fargo VA and the Lisbon home. Local children are also encouraged to do the same for Valentine's Day.

UNIT 235 ROLLA-Due to this unit's fundraising efforts including a raffle, 3 juniors were awarded scholarships, and 2 others were sponsored to attend the Peace Garden International Music Camp.
